


Why is this important for me?



We will apply this knowledge in the Spring Term to understanding how Christians behave, and then contrasting this with Muslim communities so you can understand the two biggest religious communities in Birmingham. Then we'll end the year studying

Why is this important for me? Religion is internally diverse, which means that even believers within the same religion might have different views. We study this first in Christianity and Islam to understand why there are different groups in the modern world. We then look sociologically at comparing different religions in the UK and world, before returning to understand the figure of Jesus more deeply and test some people's assumptions about him. Finally, we expand our understanding of religion to include Hinduism and end with a moral dilemma from Christian, Hindu, Islamic and non-religious perspectives.





Why is this important for me?

Judaism is the earliest Abrahamic tradition and helps us understand the other Abrahamic traditions. Exploring philosophical and ethical dilemmas in Judaeo-Christian thought helps sharpen our ability to think deeply and produce logical arguments which is why it is such a strong feature of year 9 RE. Finally, studying Sikhi rounds off our understanding of religions in the UK.
